



SUPPLIER ALERT – 2026 FIFA World Cup

Canada, Mexico, and the United States will co-host the 2026 FIFA World Cup from June 11 to July 19. Due to the scale and geographic spread, increased security complexity and operational disruptions are expected.

Demonstrations

- Protests may occur in Toronto and Vancouver, particularly near high-visibility areas and venues.
- While expected to remain largely peaceful, localized transit disruptions and road closures near BMO Field and BC Place are possible.

Travel

- Officials in both Toronto and Vancouver have advised residents to work from home and avoid driving on match days.

Toronto:

- Lake Shore Boulevard West (British Columbia Road to Bathurst Street) will be closed to regular traffic on match days.
- Dufferin Street south of Springhurst Avenue will follow the same closure schedule.
- Fort York Boulevard (between Angelique Street and Lake Shore Boulevard West) will be pedestrian-only for the full 22 days of the tournament.

Vancouver:

- Pacific Boulevard (between the Cambie Street Bridge and Carrall Street) will be closed from May 23 through the end of July.
- On the seven match days, additional closures will impact False Creek, Andy Livingstone Park, and the area surrounding BC Place.

Action

- Plan for delays, restricted access, and increased congestion when operating near host cities
- Monitor local government, transit, and emergency management updates
